Q.1. Define Singular and Plural nouns. Give examples.

Ans:- Singular nouns: singular nouns refer to one person, idea or thing.

Eg: Baby, chair, Mango, Ox, son-in-law

Plural nouns: plural nouns refer to more than one person, idea or thing.

Eg: Babies, chairs, mangoes, oxen, sons-in-law

Q.2. Define Countable and Uncountable nouns. Give examples.

Ans:- Countable nouns: countable nouns are those that refer to something that can be counted.
Eg: Cats, birds, books.

Uncountable nouns: uncountable nouns are those that refer to something that cannot be counted.

Q.1. Define nouns categories according to gender. Give examples.

Ans:- Nouns are divided into four categories according to the gender they refer to:
Masculine, Feminine, Common, Neuter genders

∴ Masculine gender → A noun that refers to a male.
Eg: Hero, milkman, bridegroom

∴ Feminine gender → A noun that refers to a female.
Eg: Heroine, milkmaid, bride

∴ Common gender → A noun that refers to both a male and a female.
Eg: Child, teacher, infant, friend

∴ Neuter gender → A noun that refers to a non-living thing that is neither a male nor a female.
Eg: Car, wood, oil, school

Q.1. Define punctuation and the use of capital letters.

Ans:- Punctuation → A set of symbols and marks which are used to clarify ^{the} meaning of a sentence or passage.

Types of punctuation :

1. Full stop [.] → The name of my school is Carmel school.
2. Comma [,] → Try, try again.
3. Question Mark [?] → What is your name?
4. Semicolon [;] → Come early; go early.
5. Colon [:] → 11:34 a.m
6. Exclamation Mark [!] → May God help you!
7. Apostrophe ['] → Ma'am → for Madam.
o'clock → for of the clock.
8. Quotation marks [Inverted Commas] [“ ”] →
The word “please” is a very useful word.

∴ Capital letter → capital letters are used to begin a sentence and for proper nouns.
‘I’ is always written in capital letter.
