Alternative Questions

Q2: Define alternative questions with examples.
Ans: Alternative questions give a choice between the options contained in the questions themselves. The options are connected by or.

- eg: 1. Are you a policeman or a soldier?
 2. Would you like to have tea or coffee?
 Who is more popular, Sanjay or Deepika?



Other Types of Questions

Q3: Define exclamatory questions with examples.
Ans: Exclamatory questions express the speaker's strong feeling. Though they have the structure of a question, they end with an exclamation mark. These questions assume that the listener agrees with the speaker.

- eg: 1. Isn't he smart!
 2. Haven't they changed!
 Wasn't that a great shot!



Q4: Define rhetorical question with examples.
Ans: A rhetorical question has the nature of a strong statement, though it has the form of a question. The speaker of a rhetorical question does not expect an answer.

- eg: 1. Can anyone count the stars? (= No one can count the stars.)
 2. Is there a limit to dreaming? (= Dreaming has no limit.)
 What difference does it make? (= It makes no difference.)

Q5: Define echo questions with examples.
Ans: Echo questions repeat a part or the whole of something already said.

- eg: 1. She is a great pianist.
She is a great what?
 2. The story is about a supernatural event.
The story is about a what event?
 He's made the mistake again.
 Who's made the mistake?
